

Cobar High School HPE and NAIDOC DAY

Cobar High School celebrated NAIDOC/HPE day on Friday. While normally, NAIDOC and HPE (Health and Physical Education) days are celebrated separately, we had the pleasure of combining them this year and focusing our NAIDOC on Tradition Indigenous Games, learning about First Nation Culture and the importance of physical activity.

We had a variety of 5 different Traditional Indigenous Games inspired by Yulunga such as; Edor: a chasing and tagging game that originated in the Aurukun Aboriginal Community, Millim Baeyeetch: a First Nations football style game that was first observed being played in parts of Victoria in the 1840's, Wana: a cricket style game played by the Noongar people in Southwest Western Australia that taught the people the importance of protecting your possessions, Thepan: which means "To Hit" in the Wik-Mungkan languages spoken in parts of North Queensland and is a game similar to Fencing (we played with pool noodles to eliminate injury), Wulijini: A Volleyball style game that was played on Bathurst Island as well as cooking, Dance and Art. We painted one of the walls inside the school with this year's NAIDOC Theme, the students also enjoyed cooking Johnny cakes while having a discussion about healthy eating habits and Dance, where the students danced and learnt about different animals.

We had "Deadly Participant" slips for staff to fill out for the students that were putting in their best efforts at each activity and there were prizes available for raffle at the end of the day with a major prize going to the student with the most slips. Students and staff enjoyed a sausage sizzle, while the school was a buzz with First Nation Artists music being played through the PA System during the lunch break. Mother nature came through with the goods by providing brilliant weather for the day and the students and the staff came through with brilliant participation and amazing vibes.









Cobar High School Taiko

Cobar High School is excited to share an original taiko piece commissioned for an outdoor performance at the Cobar Sound Chapel, made possible by the generous support of Aurelia Metals.

Musicians Graham Hilgendorf and Masae Ikegawa from YuNiOn have created a piece called 'Source', inspired by Cobar's water sources. The world premiere will take place on October 19th, with Cobar High School students performing around the Cobar Sound Chapel.

The composition starts with a bird-like opening, symbolising birds gathering at water, and then moves into powerful taiko rhythms representing the energy and flow of water. The piece draws from Cobar's water delivery trains and pipe networks.

Students have been working hard to learn and perform 'Source'. For a number of students it is their first term learning and performing taiko and are doing a brilliant job!

Thanks to a donation from Aurelia Metals, online workshops with Graham and Masae have helped students enhance their performance.
