Australian Golf Foundation Junior Girls Scholarship program

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Cobar Bowling and Golf Club are offering junior girls' golf scholarships in 2025!

Cobar Bowling and Golf Club has obtained funding from The <u>Australian Golf Foundation</u> (AGF) to support 10 lucky girls to continue to develop their golfing skills.

Scholarships are open to girls aged 9 to 16 and while the program's primary aim is to retain girls in golf by giving girls a shared golf experience, girls new to golf may also be engaged in this program should they demonstrate a commitment to learning the sport.

"This is a terrific opportunity", said Narelle Kriz Cobar's Lady Golf President, "Not only will girls receive 24 coaching sessions with My self and Gary Begg, but also a free one-year junior club membership that carries playing rights, to ensure girls can participate in club competitions and obtain a handicap".

The Scholarship program is part of a national campaign to get more girls playing golf. Along with over 160 other golf facilities across Australia, [insert centre name] will be working closely with golf's national body Golf Australia throughout 2025.

"All we ask is that applicants display a desire and willingness to improve their golf skills, obtain a handicap, play in club competitions (or at least social play) and engage in any extra-curricular activity that fosters friendships between scholarship holders".
