









Stage 4 – Engineering

The Balsa Wood Bridge Challenge was a huge success! Students began the term exploring engineering, focusing on forces and structures. Their task was to design and build a bridge using balsa wood, applying engineering principles to achieve the best strength-to-weight ratio. Congratulations to Mia and Isaiah, whose bridge weighed just 8g and held 3500g (437.5N), and to Gunnar, whose 14.9g bridge held 6200g (436.6N). Despite very different designs and weights, their bridges had a strength difference of only 0.9N - an incredible achievement! Well done, everyone - we're so proud of what you've accomplished!
